Summary: The City of Sacramento has asked the County and SacRT to partner on a SACOG Transformative grant for a Stockton Boulevard Project. The project envisions a major transformation of Stockton Boulevard from an auto-oriented thoroughfare to a high frequency transit and multi-modal corridor. This may include mobility, safety, and bus rapid or express transit improvements. The project would be from Alhambra Boulevard to Florin Road. It is anticipated that, the City of Sacramento portion would be from Alhambra Boulevard to 47th Avenue (4.3 miles). The County portion would be from 47th Avenue to Florin Road (2.2 miles). SacRT will partner on transit improvements.

The project team will request funding for Project Approval and Environmental Document (PA&ED) for the whole project and Plans, Specifications, and Estimates for a portion of City-only segments. The City of Sacramento would apply for the Grant and be the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) lead for the Project requesting approximately \$3.9 million for PA&ED. The County will coordinate with the City and provide approximately \$150,000 in local matching funds for this grant. Authority is requested for the Director of SacDOT to submit the grant as a co-applicant. Authority is further sought to negotiate and execute a funding agreement with the City; and an agreement to define roles and responsibilities with the City and, if needed, SacRT, for this project should the grant be awarded.

Funding Source(s): 2022/23 Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) Regional Funding Round (SACOG Programs) for which the County is partnering with the City of Sacramento and the Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT)

Background Information:

The SACOG Regional Funding Program grants funding from a variety of sources to local government agencies and their partners to projects that meet performance outcomes, overall policy, and selection considerations identified by the SACOG Board of Directors. The Regional Funding Program is divided into two categories; Transformative projects and Maintenance and Modernization. The Transformative program is for projects with a request of \$5 million or higher, and projects that will create new capacity through roadway expansions or new transit service. The Transformative program has a cap of 25 percent of the Regional Program budget, or \$28 million.

Call for projects for the Transformative program opens on October 24, 2022 and the project applications deadline is February 8, 2023.



Project Intent





- Member expressed concern for the lack of a delineator between the roadway and bikeway based on standards of the design information bulletin for a class IV.
- Upon review of updated bulletin, it was found that a vertical separation from the curb would suffice; consultant stated the minimum width of the trapezoidal delineator should be 12 inches.
 Member suggested increasing the visibility of the slopes of the trapezoidal delineator by the use of green or yellow paint.
- Use of one-way signage was highly recommended by the Committee.

- For the Elkhorn project, members pointed out the need to increase pedestrian and bicycle visibility due to the large number of collisions in the project area.
- Committee emphasized their support for policy development that would standardize the use of green paint in bike lanes.
- One committee member shared it may be necessary to amend the General Plan for the Stockton project. To ensure enough room for a Class IV bikeway, the project will likely require the reduction of currently planned buildout of three lanes in each direction to two lanes, depending on how much ROW is acquired.
